CONTRACT WITH TRI-MOR COPORATION FOR THE HALBURTON ROAD IMPROVEMENTS – PHASE 2 PROJECT

This Contract is entered into by and between TRI-MOR CORPORATION, 8530 North Boyle Parkway, Twinsburg, Ohio 44087 ("Contractor") and the CITY OF BEACHWOOD, OHIO, 25325 Fairmount Boulevard, Beachwood, Ohio 44122 ("City");

WHEREAS, the Clerk of Council, pursuant to a Motion passed by Council on February 19, 2019, advertised for bids for the work and/or services, hereinafter described, on March 21, 2019 and March 22, 2019 and on March 21, 2019 and March 28, 2019 which bids were due on or before 1:00 o'clock P.M. on Friday, April 5, 2019, at which time all bids were publicly opened and immediately tabulated and filed for public inspection with the Clerk of Council; and

WHEREAS, Council received the tabulation of the bids at a Public meeting held on **April 15, 2019,** at which time Council adopted **Ordinance No. 2019-51** approving the bid of the Contractor to be the lowest and best bid ("Bid") and awarding this Contract.

WITNESSETH, that in consideration of the Contractor being recommended by the Public Works Director and chosen by the City, and for the money considerations provided herein, the parties covenant and agree as follows:

1. Based upon the recommendation of the Public Works Director, and as approved by City Council, the Mayor is authorized to enter into this Contract for Halburton Road Improvements – Phase 2 Project with the Contractor, in an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Seventy Four Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety Six Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$774,296.50).

2. The Contractor shall provide labor and materials for the Halburton Road Improvements – Phase 2 Project as submitted in its bid proposal and in accordance with the City's specifications. Before commencing any work, Contractor shall submit an action plan for approval by the Beachwood Police Department showing the means the Contractor will use to comply with the Supervision and Safety requirements contained in the specifications. All work shall be completed in accordance with a time schedule approved by the Public Works Director.

3. The Contractor shall furnish the Public Works Director and City Finance Director with a record of services rendered monthly, not later than five (5) days following the end of each month of the activity on forms approved by the Finance Director.

4. The Contractor is an independent contractor, having discretion over the means, methods and details of the services to be performed consistent with the overall goals and policies of the Public Works Department of the City of Beachwood, and shall provide all equipment, materials and labor necessary to perform the services. Contractor shall provide any necessary training of its employees. Contractor shall be responsible for arranging for Workers' Compensation coverage or equivalent for its employees, and shall deliver to the City a copy of a certificate showing compliance with such laws and shall comply with all laws applicable in the City of Beachwood or the State of Ohio. Contractor shall be responsible for any changes in the prevailing wage rates or classifications throughout its performance of this Contract.

5. The City shall be entitled to cancel this Contract upon giving a five (5) days written notice to the Contractor for failure of the Contractor to comply with any of the provisions of this Contract or to furnish furnish satisfactory work in connection with the required services. The City shall be entitled to terminate this Contract immediately upon a determination by the Public Works Director or Safety Director of the City that any act or omission arising from the work jeopardizes the safety or health of any person. The Contractor shall perform all work in accordance with all Federal, State and local laws and regulations governing such services. The Contractor shall operate during times approved and specified by the City.

6. Contractor shall provide labor and materials for the Halburton Road Improvements – Phase 2 Project without any sub-contractors and will provide proper supervision and supervisory personnel in connection therewith.

7. Contractor shall furnish the City with evidence of general liability insurance from a company licensed by the State of Ohio in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for any accidental occurrence arising out of any act or omission by the Contractor which causes bodily harm or property damage, and shall cause the City to be named as an additional insured on the policy. Contractor agrees to fully defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all claims, demands or causes of action for personal injury, property damage or otherwise arising from the services provided under this Contract, and whether involving employee claims or third party claims.

8. Ohio law prohibits any state agency or political subdivision from awarding a Contract, in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), for goods, services, or construction to any person against whom a finding of recovery has been issued by the Auditor of State, if that finding is unresolved. Contractor certifies that an unresolved finding for recovery has not been issued against Contractor and attached is a completed Findings For Recovery Certification.

9. This Contract consists of this instrument and the component parts all of which are incorporated herein by reference as if fully rewritten, numbered and signed by the parties. Such documents, unless waived in writing by the Law Director, shall include, but are not limited to, plans and drawings, specifications, warranties, performance bond approved by the City Law Director, proof of satisfactory liability insurance, proof of workers' compensation coverage in accordance with the laws of Ohio, the laws of the City of Beachwood, copies of advertisement, bid tabulations and purchase orders.

10. It shall be the responsibility of Tri-Mor Corporation to obtain a copy of the purchase order issued by the City for the approved amount of this Contract. Furthermore, it shall be the responsibility of Tri-Mor Corporation to track remaining funds available and to not invoice the City for any amounts not approved by the terms of this Contract. Any alterations to this Contract shall conform to BCO 121.09(a). Invoices that exceed the approved amount of this Contract will not be paid by the City.

11. In the event of dispute, the Contractor first shall be required to and shall have the right to appeal directly to the Council of the City of Beachwood, and a decision by Council shall be a condition precedent to the institution of any litigation in a court of competent jurisdiction. Any legal action arising out of this Contract shall be brought only in a court of competent jurisdiction sitting in Cuyahoga County, Ohio.

12. This Contract may be executed by electronic mail, facsimile and in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall be deemed to be one and the same instrument.

13. Contractor acknowledges that no modifications can be made to this Contract without prior written action and prior approval by the Mayor and City Council.

14. This Contract represents the entire agreement between the parties, will be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio, and shall be binding upon both parties. This Contract cannot be assigned by the Contractor without the prior written permission of the City.

We have received 2 bids and one response informing us that they cannot provide a bid, for Bus Transportation for our Summer Camps. The lowest and best bid is from First Student.

First Student has provided Summer Bus Camp Transportation for us the past 6 years and has been a reliable vendor for us. The bid came in at \$43.50 per hour per bus, with billing starting at their bus garage (3381 East Waterloo, Akron) and ending at the last drop off location in Beachwood. These are the exact same prices and terms as last year.

We recommend accepting this quotation and entering into a contract with First Student.

CONTRACT WITH FIRST STUDENT, INC. FOR BUS TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR THE CITY OF BEACHWOOD, OHIO RECREATION DIVISION 2019 SUMMER CAMPS AND PROGRAMS

This Contract is entered into by and between FIRST STUDENT, INC., 3381 East Waterloo Road, Akron, Ohio 44312 ("Contractor") and the CITY OF BEACHWOOD, 25325 Fairmount Boulevard, Beachwood, Ohio 44122 ("City");

WITNESSETH, upon the recommendation of the Community Services Director and the Recreation Supervisor, and the approval of Council, for the money considerations provided herein, the parties covenant and agree as follows:

1. Contractor shall provide bus transportation services related to the City's 2019 Summer Camps and Recreation Programs in the City of Beachwood, Ohio in accordance with the City's proposal request and the Contractor's quotation, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. Daily shuttles will be a rate of Forty-Three Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$43.50) per hour, per bus, for 72 passenger buses (three per seat), and operating during the Day Camp Schedule, including field trips. Billing will start from 3381 East Waterloo Road, Akron, Ohio 44312 and end at the last drop off location in Beachwood, Ohio.

2. Contractor agrees to report at the City's designated location fifteen (15) minutes prior to each scheduled departure.

3. The City shall provide supervision of the children and other guests of all participants in its Summer Camps and Programs during the times the Contractor's transportation vehicles are in use.

4. Contractor shall furnish the Community Services Director and Finance Director with a record of services rendered monthly, not later than five (5) days following the end of each month, on forms approved by the Finance Director.

5. It shall be the responsibility of First Student, Inc. to obtain a copy of the purchase order issued by the City for the approved amount of this Contract. Furthermore, it shall be the responsibility of First Student, Inc. to track remaining funds available and to not invoice the City for any amounts not approved by the terms of this Contract. Any alterations to this Contract shall conform to BCO 121.09(a). Invoices that exceed the approved amount of this Contract will not be paid by the City

6. The Contractor is an independent Contractor who shall provide all equipment, materials and labor necessary to perform the work. Contractor shall be responsible for arranging for workers' compensation coverage for its employees and shall deliver to the City a copy of a certificate showing compliance with such laws. Contractor further agrees to file an income tax return with the City of Beachwood Tax Department in accordance with municipal tax laws.

7. The City shall be entitled to cancel this Contract upon giving five (5) days written notice to the Contractor for failure of the Contractor to comply with any of the provisions of this Contract or to furnish satisfactory work in connection with the required services. The City shall be entitled to terminate this Contract immediately upon a determination by the Community Services Director or Safety Director of the City that any act or omission arising from the work jeopardizes the safety or health of any person. The Contractor shall perform all work in accordance with all Federal, State and local laws and regulations governing such services. The Contractor shall perform services during times approved and specified by the City.

8. Contractor shall provide the services without any sub-contractors and shall provide proper supervision and supervisory personnel in connection with all of the services performed. Contractor is responsible for all employee background checks.

9. Contractor shall furnish the City with evidence of general liability insurance from a company licensed by the State of Ohio in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for any accidental occurrence arising out of any act or omission by the Contractor that causes bodily harm or property damage and shall cause the City to be named as an additional insured on the policy. Contractor agrees to fully defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all claims, demands or causes of action for personal injury, property damage or otherwise arising from the work and services provided, whether involving employee claims or third party claims.

10. Ohio law prohibits any state agency or political subdivision from awarding a contract, in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), for goods, services, or construction to any person against whom a finding of recovery has been issued by the Auditor of State, if that finding is unresolved. Contractor certifies that an unresolved finding for recovery has not been issued against Contractor and attached is a completed Findings For Recovery Certification.

11. This Agreement may be executed by electronic mail, facsimile or in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall be deemed to be one and the same instrument.

12. Contractor acknowledges that no modifications, including but not limited to change orders, can be made to this Contract without prior written action and prior approval by the Mayor and City Council.

13. This Contract represents the entire agreement between the parties, is governed by the laws of the State of Ohio, and shall be binding upon both parties. This Contract cannot be assigned by the Contractor without the prior written permission of the City.

14. This Contract shall be effective at the start of the City's Recreation Division 2019 Summer Camps and Programs through the close of camp as advertised by the City.

Barkwood, the City of Beachwood's first dog park is under construction and slated to open on or before July 7, 2019.

Our internal team can deliver Barkwood under budget.

For \$137,987, we can offer 75% turf coverage or 16,200 sf. The additional 6,900 footage would be exposed stone (the under base.) There are several parks in the area that use stone as their base.

We are requesting an increase to our original budget of \$150,000 of \$15,000 to allow for 100% turf coverage. The additional turf expense is \$12, 874. From aesthetics to maintenance over the length of the project, this will be money well spent.

In our initial proposal, we had not yet determined the nature of the ground cover to be used. After debating grass vs. artificial turf, it was determined that the artificial surface, although more expensive, would also eliminate a lot of future maintenance expense. The cost of installing an initial irrigation system, weekly cutting, watering, and the extra work in shutting down periodically to re-seed was determined to be in excess of \$100,000 over 10 years.

It is also worth noting that several of the expenses attributed to the budget of this park will actually go to long range improvements in the whole Beachwood Park East. The installation of water on that side of the park requires Cleveland Water to install a "water vault." This was initially estimated at a high figure of \$21,500. In reality, depending on how the trenching is done, it may come in as low as \$16,000. Having water on that side of the street will allow us to add a comfort station or possibly another pavilion (with bathrooms) in years to come, as the East side of the park gets busier.

Also, the cost of bringing in electrical service and fiber for both the locked entrance gate and a security camera are costs that would be necessary as use in the East Park expands. Together, these costs are about \$10,000. In the future, it is the administration's plan to introduce additional security cameras on both sides of the park.

It is also worth noting that we will be selling key fobs for \$25@. 200 fobs will yield an additional \$5,000 in income which also can be applied to the additional turf expense.
